## **SJRCS Student Council Election Guidelines**

The following rules apply for the Student Council Elections:

- Applications will be available from Mrs. Rensberger or Mrs. Pessagno beginning Monday,
   September 9<sup>th</sup>.
- Signed, completed applications are due to Mrs. Karen Smith no later than 2:30 p.m. on Thursday, September 12<sup>th</sup>. Failure to have the application completed correctly and/or handing it in past the deadline will result in disqualification. Current officers of NJHS are not eligible to run for an office on Student Council.
- No election activity is allowed during class time.
- Only 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade students may sign petitions.
- September 16<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup>, and 18<sup>th</sup> are campaign days.
- Posters may only be placed on the second floor and must be removed at the end of the day on Wednesday, September 18<sup>th</sup>. You may only use paint safe tape.
- Any destruction of campaign materials by a candidate will result in the loss of the privilege to run for office.
- Primary elections will be held in 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms on Wednesday, September 18<sup>th</sup>, right before lunch.
- The two candidates for each office who receive the highest number of votes will be on the final ballot and will give election speeches on Monday, September 23rd, right after lunch.
- The general election will follow the speeches.
- Homeroom representatives will be elected during homeroom on the morning of Friday, September 27<sup>th</sup>, after the results of the General Election have been announced. Two representatives from each 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, and 8<sup>th</sup> grade homeroom are to be elected. (See other side for information about running for class representative.)
- Newly elected officers will be installed at the first Student Council meeting on Wednesday, October 2nd.
- Please note that ALL Student Council meetings will be held on Wednesdays, after school, from 2:30-3:15. Please do not run for an office or to be a homeroom rep unless you are available to attend meetings at this time.

## **Article X: Class Representatives**

At an Executive Committee meeting held on September 29, 2008, the following change was made in requirements and procedures for selecting class representatives.

- Any student who wishes to be considered as a class representative must have no grades lower than a C (A) on an interim or progress report.
- Candidate must have satisfactory effort and conduct.
- Candidate must have been a student at SJRCS for one year. (C)
- Any student who wishes to be considered as a class representative must complete a form and submit to (D) his/her homeroom teacher for verification of grades.
- Once grades have been verified, homeroom teachers will allow time for students to present to their homeroom members why they would like to be their representative on Student Council.
- Homeroom members will vote by secret ballot. The names of their two choices for class representative should be written on the ballot.
- Homeroom teachers will tally the ballots and send the class selections to the Principal and will also announce the selected students in their homerooms.
